Our sibling denomination, the United Church of Christ (UCC), has for years if not decades, been using the slogan God is still speaking. Not being a part of the UCC I can't comment on the ways that they have used the phrase, but I do believe it to be true. I believe this because God has spoken to me and I know others to whom God has spoken. In all likelihood God has spoken to you too.

In the scriptures God speaks to people in a multitude of ways. Sometimes God speaks directly, as God did to Moses at the burning bush and then on Mt. Sinai. People often hear from God through angels (divine messengers), including Abraham, Hagar, Zachariah, and Mary. Dreams and visions are another way in which God communicates to

people, including Jacob, Joseph (the son of Jacob), and Joseph (Mary's husband and the adoptive father of Jesus). A frequent method of divine communication, especially to groups of people is

through prophets. The prophet will have a vision from God and then serve as the messenger to kings, tribes, and nations. God's communication with people in the Bible is regular and varied, even among the methods mentioned there is variation in how God speaks.

God's communication with people didn't stop after Bible times, as the UCC slogan says, God is still speaking. I have "heard" God speak to me throughout my life in a variety of ways, though not audibly. God has spoken to me through scripture, through a voice heard, not by my ears, but by my spirit, and through other people. One of the most powerful ways I've had God speak to me was through a sense of God's loving presence. No words spoken or written

were needed, in that moment I felt the presence of God and with it came the knowledge that I was abundantly loved by my Creator. It was a powerful message and one that I needed at that time. I know of others who have had God speak to them through ways similar to my experience or that of people in the scriptures.

God is still speaking, perhaps you can tell of a time when you have had God speak to you. Communication from God is not something reserved for the pious, holy, or worthy, but is rather something that happens anytime God wishes. It can't be forced and it doesn't happen on our time table or in a way of our choosing. The reality that God is still speaking begs the question of us, are we still listening?

Our openness to God's communication with us is a key component of prayer. Being open to how God may speak to us is just as important a part of our prayer life as how we speak to God. Through our worship, prayer,

scripture reading, service to others, as well as our rest and recreation we place ourselves in a space to receive the word God has for us in a given moment. Sometimes the word God speaks to us is for us and sometimes it is a message to be shared with a specific person or group or everyone.

Ultimately, to be open to God's speaking to us is to take a posture of humble and faithful openness to God, however and whenever God may speak. As we worship and proclaim a living God, so to do we worship and proclaim a God who is still speaking.

So what is God saying to you, through you, to us?

Blessed be our God and blessed be God's people, now and forever.



Buffalo Food Shelf

Here are the end of year results from the food shelf. The new food shelf director is Laureen Bodin.

DONORS:

21% individuals, 31% business, 12% clubs, 10% fundraising, 16% United Way/third party.

TOTAL DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD

16,310 pounds – an increase of roughly 6,000 pounds compared to 2023 There was an increase of food donated – 294,142 pounds total, as compared to the same period in 2023. Rescue food accounts for 65-68% of total food distribution. Rescue food is that food received from stores such as Cub, Coborn's, Walmart, and Target.

KIDS' CHOICE – This program is for children specifically who come with their parents and held during school breaks at Christmas and in summer. In July there was a record number of 50+ children per night in the first week and 40+ children per night the second week. Over the summer, 664 children were given 15,048 pounds of food.

There are deliveries to seniors at Woodmere and Lakeside as well as Friday distributions rotating from Grace Place, Buffalo Community Center, and Buffalo Food Shelf.

Community Breakfasts – Community Center. There was an average of 150 people served per month at the Community Center. The Community Center breakfasts are no longer going to be available at the Center.

Holiday Baskets – Holiday food vouchers from Cub for turkey (Thanksgiving) and ham (Easter) are given as well as pies. A total of 600 baskets, split between two months, are packed and distributed.

Session Summary

Highlights of the January 21 Stated Session Meeting and the January 26 Congregational Meeting

Session approves 2025 budget

Buffalo Presbyterian Church's (BPC) budget in 2025 lists income of \$198,085 and expenditures of \$201,614. The Session approved the budget noting that the \$3,500 projected deficit should be covered by a variety of factors including expected pledged giving above that which was pledged for 2025, and the expectation that funds that were set aside to cover pastoral expenses during Pastor Entz' sabbatical won't be totally spent. The church

also entered the year with a \$30,000 checking account balance. The Session would make budget adjustments during the year if income decreases or expenses increase. It was noted in the annual report the pledged giving was down about 12% even though we received three more pledges this year than last year.

BPC-Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church (SOJ) lease agreement moves forward

With assurances from the presbytery's Board of Trus-

tees attorney that the lease agreement between BPC and SOJ is in order, the session approved a five-year lease with Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church. The Lutherans have already approved the agreement. The Board of Trustees for the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area is expected to formally approve the lease at their February meeting. The Session also approved Elders Don Eddy and Chuck Klaassen to continue as our church's liaisons with SOJ through 2025.

Eddy will head Nominating Committee

Elder Don Eddy will chair the 2025 BPC Nominating Committee. Other members are Deacon Barb Janski, and at-large members Eric Ellwoods, Mary Marke-Patch, and Pat Olsen. They will seek nominees to fill open positions on the Session and Board of Deacons. If they contact you to serve, prayerfully consider whether you would be willing to accept this invitation to leadership.


