

Missions

Buffalo Food Shelf

The Buffalo Food Shelf has a program named "Kid's Choice." It is specifically for children and their families to come to the Food Shelf to pick up food. They had specific dates in June, July, and August when foods were distributed:

June, 180 children were served; 3,960 lbs. July, 264 children served; 5,808 lbs. August, 220 children served; 5,280 lbs.

The final Kid's Choice for 2024 will be held during the Christmas break: 12/17, 12/19, 12/20, 12/26, and 12/27.

The BFS Holiday Basket Program is soon to begin. Each basket will contain a variety of holiday meal items including: pie, pumpkin for Thanksgiving and apple for Christmas. Also, a voucher for a turkey (November) or a ham (December) will be given clients to redeem at Cub Foods.

These baskets will be given out during regular Food Shelf hours with Thanksgiving, November 1 through November 26 and Christmas, December 2 through December 20. The Buffalo Community Center, Woodmere, and Lakeside will have their meals delivered to each location on November 20 and December 18.

The Food Shelf is planning on packing and distributing 300 baskets each month for a total of 600 holiday meal kits through the Food Shelf, Buffalo Community Center, Woodmere, and Lakeside.

Sabbatical?!? What Is That?

There is a "new word" floating around Buffalo Presbyterian Church recently. Perhaps this word is unfamiliar to you. This article is intended to help you understand the term and its impact on possible future events for the congregation and its leadership. The term is "Sabbatical."

There are several definitions available online and they are all similar. The general meaning is: A sabbatical leave is a prolonged period of time away from work that employees can take for a variety of reasons, including personal growth, research, or travel. Sabbaticals can be paid or unpaid, and can last from a few weeks to several months. Time with family and personal care are benefits as well.

In the Presbyterian Church U.S.A., a Sabbatical is usually paid leave for the pastor, generally a period of three months, for the purpose of rest and renewal. The Sabbatical is most productive when it is planned along with the congregation, since both the pastor and the congregation will be experiencing different styles of worship and study during the time.

Sabbatical leave is a practice most often in church or academic professions. The Church considers it to be important because, unlike most other areas of employment, the pastor is involved with the members on a 24/7 basis, often during the most stressful times of their lives, in addition to the usual pastoral requirements of worship and sermon planning, education, and general administration. A period of renewal, away from the congregation, is beneficial for both parties, and both will be refreshed and revitalized to continue the work of the church in the community.




SPOT~You Are Not Alone: Finding Hope in Grief

Highlights of the October 15 Stated Session Meeting

Facilities discussion with Spirit of Joy Lutheran continue

Don Eddy and Chuck Klaassen will represent Buffalo Presbyterian Church (BPC) in discussions with two representatives from Spirit of Joy (SOJ) Lutheran Church regarding the possibility of sharing our facility with the Lutheran congregation. The Session also met with a visioning group from SOJ and discussed their using the current nursery for office space and one of the coat areas for storage. Their church plans to worship on Sunday afternoons. They would also like one evening, possibly Thursday, where they would have primary use of the building. Contact Chuck or Don if you have any questions or thoughts about the arrangement.

Session sets special congregational meeting and Christmas Eve worship time

Members will have a chance to comment on the budget,

consider the pastor's terms of call, and review the adequacy of our staff's compensation, and elect at-large members to the nominating committee at a special congregational meeting on Sunday, December 8, following worship.

The Session also approved a slight time change in the Christmas Eve service. This year the service is scheduled for 4:00 pm.

Church receives survey of land that may be sold

Otto and Associates have surveyed the land parcel being considered for sale by the church. The parcel is large enough for three residential homesites and allows access to the church property from the south off Sixth Street NE. The next steps for the Session are to inform the presbytery of the potential sale and get an appraisal of the land's value.
