

#### Red Cross Blood Drive


Our next Blood Drive will be March 3rd from noon to 6pm. Sign up online at Red-CrossBlood.org, enter 55313.

#### The Spiral of Time: Looking Back and Moving Forward

The definition of a sabbatical is an extended break from work that allows a pastor to focus on something other than their regular job duties. After 7 years of employment, pastors are invited to take a sabbatical.

In 2025, Pastor Brian will be on sabbatical starting around April 29 and returning July 28. The theme he is contemplating is **The Spiral of Time: looking back and moving forward.**Looking back and moving forward offers the opportunity to examine church history, his

family history, and history in general while also contemplating what our faith and the work of the church look like moving forward.

During this time, our congregation is welcome to explore this theme as well and also intersect it with the celebration of our 150th Anniversary. Session has been preparing for this event by setting aside money to cover the 3 months.

Worship & Music; and Kathy Quady, <u>Personnel</u>. Brian and Christy will also help with planning. We will also have support from surrounding pastors as well as Presbytery.

# Session Summary

Highlights of the December 8 Special Congregational Meeting and the December 17 Stated Session Meeting

#### Congregation reviews budget and approves pastor's terms-of-call

Congregational members commented on the budget, approved the pastor's terms of call, reviewed the adequacy of Buffalo Presbyterian Church's (BPC) staff's compensation, and elected at-large members to the nominating committee at call and judged that the rea special congregational meeting on Sunday, December 8, following worship.

Members asked about the projected budget deficit caused by a decrease in

pledged giving. Elder Theresa Bevilacqua and Treasurer Mandy Harkess indicated that at least one major pledge had not yet been received and that the Session would be looking at more up-to-date projected income at their December meeting. The congregation approved Pastor Entz' 2025 terms of maining staff salaries were adequate. All staff will receive a three-percent wage increase in 2025.

The congregation also elected Eric Ellwoods, Pat Olsen and Mary Markve-Patch as at-large members to the Nominating Committee. They will be working with an Elder and a Deacon to suggest nominations for openings on the Session and Board of Deacons. Session approves insurance, budget, and appointments

Elder Don Eddy presented insurance quotes for 2025. The Session approved continuing with North Star Mutual Insurance. The \$700

increase in premiums was less that the company had earlier projected. The Session also approved a budget for 2025 which was essentially the same as the one presented to the congregation on December 8. Elders agreed that modifications could occur in 2025 if income was not meeting expenditures.

Church Treasurer Mandv Harkess and Clerk Mike Quady were re-appointed to those positions in 2025. Barb Janski and Joan Lowe will continue representing BPC as commissioners to the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area. Kathy and Mike Quady will continue as alternate commissioners.


